Symbols of Majesty: Just a Thought

In just a few weeks' time the coronation service of King Charles III will take place in Westminster Abbey. At that service, the king will be invested with various symbols of majesty: the orb, sceptre, and crown. Yet hidden from view will be an ordinary looking slab of sandstone concealed under the throne. This is the Stone of Scone, otherwise known as the Stone of Destiny. Regardless of whether symbols are made from precious metals, or more common elements, their power is not defined by their material value. They have an imbued nobility. This is all the more obvious in the case of the Stone of Scone,

given that it is literally, just a rock. Yet, of



all the symbols that will feature at the coronation, it is the Stone of Destiny that most piques my attention. It does so, precisely because its "ordinariness" reminds me of a far greater coronation. In the New Testament, the passion of the Christ can be read as an enthronement narrative. Matthew's gospel recalls: "The soldiers stripped Jesus and put a scarlet robe on him, and then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on his head. They put a staff in his right hand. Then they knelt in front of him and mocked him. "Hail, king of the Jews!" they said."

Here Jesus is mockingly adorned with symbols of majesty, and yet ironically, He really is the King of kings: with a reed for a sceptre, thorns for a crown, and a cross for a throne. As the saying goes, "many a true word is spoken in jest." Easter is the coronation of the Great King, who even now reaches out to us with the most commonplace of symbols, the water of baptism, and the bread and wine of Holy Communion.


