Palm Sunday Walk to Church - Palm Sunday is traditionally a day when 'Christ is King' is proclaimed in the wider community. Maundy Thursday - Our wonderful tradition at St Paul's is to mark Maundy Thursday (the night of the Last Supper and Gethsemane) by joining together at 6.30pm (for 7pm) for a Passover-style meal. This is followed by a simple communion service, together with a reading of the Gethsemane 'Watch' story. We then depart silently in preparation for Good Friday. The meal of three courses (fish with bitter herbs, lamb and a sweet course) is punctuated by readings and prayers and concludes with The Peace as we lead into Communion.
